

- Lack of awareness challenges




Health Care Access & Quality

Screening Process

 Electronically VS. hard copy

Investment in data system upgrades

 High tech methods VS. "low-tech" methods

Who will capture data

 Provider, front desk staff, patient

Who and How it will be accessed

- Care team access VS. specific provider
- Available in EHR, physical patient profile

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Building Rapport/Trust

Multilingual Staff administering the tool/questionnaire

• If any bilingual staff or contractor is available, reach out to other organizations or to community leaders. They can serve as interpreters.

CHWs, Outreach Workers

Building rapport/trust with the community

- Introduce yourself, who you work for, what you/your health center do
- Explain why you are collecting information and how it will help them
- Be a little informal when approaching and create a friendly conversation while doing the assessments
- Let them know that they can call your health center for any additional information

Using culturally informed terminology

Cross train staff to administer screener among patients

• Learning how to have an open conversation, because sometimes the screening questions can be very personal.

Identify the social service assets and gaps within the community


Help patients understand their benefits


